Stow Wengenroth

Stow Wengenroth (1906-1978) was an American artist and lithographer, born in Brooklyn, New York. He was once called "America's greatest living artist working in black and white" by the realist painter Andrew Wyeth, and he is generally considered to be one of the finest American lithographers of the twentieth century. He was also the author of several influential books on lithography. Wengenroth's lithographs are found in most major American collections, including the Library of Congress, Whitney Museum of American Art, and Metropolitan Museum of Art.
